- Acupuncture	- Legal Expenses - authorizing treatment of mental illness
- Alcoholism - treatment	
- Ambulance - hire	- Lifetime Medical Care - prepaid; retirement home
- Autoette or Wheelchair	
- Birth Control Pills	- Limbs - artificial
- Blind Persons Services	- Mattress - prescribed for alleviation of arthritis
- Braces	- Membership Fees - association furnishing medical services, hospitalization, and clinical care
- Capital Expenditures - home modifications for handicapped - primary purpose must be medical care	- Nursing Home - medical reasons
- Car Equipment - to accommodate wheelchair and/or handicapped controls	- Nursing Services - board and Social Security paid by taxpayers
- Childbirth Preparation Classes - mother	- Obstetrical Expenses
- Chiropractors	- Operations - legal
- Christian Science Treatment	- Optometrists
- Contact Lenses - replacement insurance	- Orthodontia
- Crutches	- Orthopedic Shoes - excess costs
- Deaf Persons - hearing aid and batteries, hearing aid animal and care, lip reading expenses, special education, modified telephone	- Oxygen / Oxygen Equipment
- Dental Fees	- Prosthesis
- Dentures	- Psychiatric Care
- Diagnostic Fees	- Psychologists
- Diapers (adult disposable) - used due to severe neurological disease	- Psychotherapists
- Doctor's Fees	- Reclining Chair - for cardiac patients
- Domestic Aid - rendered by nurse	- Remedial Reading
- Drug Addiction Recovery	- Retarded Person - costs for special home.
- Drugs - prescription or over-the-counter *	- Retirement Home - lifetime medical care
- Dyslexia Language Training	- Sanitarium Rest Home - medical, educational, rehabilitative services
- Elevator for Alleviation of Cardiac Condition	- Schools - special, relief, or handicapped
- Eyeglasses and Examination Fees	- Sexual Dysfunction Treatment
- Fluoride Device - on advice of dentist	- Sterilization
- Halfway House - adjustment to mental hospital	- Surgical Fees
- Healing Services Fees	- Swimming Pool - treatment of polio or arthritis
- Health Maintenance Organization	- Teeth - artificial
	- Television - closed-caption decoder

- Hearing Aids	- Therapy Treatments - prescribed by a physician
- Hospital Care	- Transportation - essentially and primarily for medical care
- Insulin	- Weight Loss Programs - as a treatment for the disease of obesity
- Laboratory Fees	- Wheelchair or Autoette
- Laetrile - by prescription	- X-rays
- Lead Paint Removal	- Mileage
- Lazer eye surgery	- Stop smoking programs
- Lodging (treatment related, and with restrictions, up to \$50 per person)	- Vasectomy
- Medical conference fees (relating to chronic illness; no lodging or meals)	- Vision correction
- Medicare Parts A and B	- Stop-smoking programs

*** Note: Over-the-counter drugs will no longer be considered qualified expenses after January 1, 2011. Enrollee must have a prescription for over-the-counter items in order to purchase using HSA funds.**
